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



Early Childhood Assessments Kindergarten - KIDS

KIDS is an observational formative assessment.

Children are observed and evidence can be collected daily throughout each rating period. This evidence is then used to complete the assessment for that period. The assessment is completed three times per school year.

- 1st rating is due within 40 days of attendance; the evidence used is from attendance days 1-40
- 2nd rating is due within 105 days of attendance; the evidence used is from attendance days 41-105
- 3rd rating is due within 170 days of attendance; the evidence used is from attendance days 106-170







A Conversation Protocol


- 1) Listen *
- 2) Reassure
- 3) Validate
- 4) Respond *
- 5) Repair
- 6) Resolve *







A Conversation Protocol



- 1) Listen deeply to the message being sent *
- 2) Reassure the person that his or her perspective is important
- 3) Validate the person's emotional state
- 4) Respond with a statement about what occurred through your lens *
- 5) Repair with a heartfelt apology and heal the relationship
- 6) Resolve by coming to terms with what happened and collaborate to find ways to prevent future challenges of the same type *


